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

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MANWOMAN Holy Screen Time!







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The line between Art and Life for Manwoman was thin, brilliantly colored and drawn with expertise. He embraced his calling as an artist, an activist, a writer and, it must be said, as a performer. He was known to dress in yellow, he drove a yellow van and a yellow Cadillac convertible, championing the good and eschewing misrepresentation. He had a third eye tattooed on his forehead and his body covered in over 200 renditions of the swastika, reclaimed from indigenous and religious cultures. He worked at banishing the stigma that the symbol had acquired since The Holocaust, managing to advocate against all the evil that image had born under Hitler. Needless to say he got into trouble for his views, but throughout his career, he managed to impart an extreme positivity.

Those who knew Manwoman usually have a story to tell. Here is one: The Powerhouse Theatre's production of *Talking With* had been brought to Prince George for The BC Festival of the Arts in 1986. I played a psychotic baton twirler, one of a number of females in an all-woman script with a no-named author, although it had been thought that Tennessee Williams may have written it. It was political and edgy. As it happened, Manwoman was exhibiting at that festival as well. Princess Diana and Prince Charles opened the festival and at the opening ceremonies, as I talked with Manwoman, the royal couple's secret security men removed him from the premises, suspicious of the way he looked. Later, Manwoman did a silkscreen print of Diana standing slim, perfectly dressed (in yellow) and beautiful. Beside her is Mr. Death. It could have been a maleficent image, but because Manwoman had such a lively participation in 'the other side', he doesn't render Mr. Death as a character to be feared, more as an inevitable ally.

There is a great benign aura that emanates from the 67 silkscreens. There are rendered visions of celestial spaces, animals where the gaze from the paper is full of goodwill, cuddly children play, nuns frolic as they clean, and doves inhabit the inner channels of the swastika. Even the commercial world and the oft criticized manipulation of advertising is put through a filter of goodness. Sex, too, isn't hidden or shamed, but nor is it flaunted. Manwoman had depicted an overall acceptance of the variety of experiences that make up the physical world as he saw life, affected by his spiritual visions. Compelled to share his inspiration, Manwoman created images that provoke smiles and reaffirm life in all permutations.

This is not the first time Manwoman's work has been in Vernon. He had a show at the first Headbones Gallery in the 90's when he delivered his large pop paintings in his yellow van. He returned for the first Headbones Fashion Show where his yellow suit with flying hearts was modelled. His works have been in the Headbones Drawers and shown in exhibitions both here and in Toronto. This is the first time that such a quantity of his silkscreen prints have been shown together and yet even this is not comprehensive as some editions have been sold out and are no longer available. His work ethic is obvious.

The exhibition bears testimony to an artist whose skill was exemplary. The clarity and depth of color are profound, his registration meticulous, and his imagery articulate and often humorous. Manwoman died at 74 in his hometown of Cranbrook, surrounded by his works and artifacts and leaving behind children and grandchildren. Loved by many, respected and befriended by even more, he described himself as a "normal, beer guzzling, girl chasing, car-crazy Canadian youth" but actually, 'exceptional' is a better description. Fueled by visions, inspired by religions, as creative as the hours of the day allowed – his work speaks for him now.










Instant God




Pink Cadillac






Sisters of Mercy Logo - 1986 Acrylic on canvas, 48x36"


















Gentle Swastika




Mr Death


