## JIM KALNIN - Intrinsic Habitats

Some people here in the Okanagan know the artist, Jim Kalnin, as 'Feather' from the time when he lived in Stock's Meadow, the communal settlement "behind those hills" between Fintry and Bear Creek, - long before Okanagan Resort became an architectonic resort and destination on Westside Road. This was when Westside was still gravel and in parts like Nahun, it was a oneway, one-cart track where you had to toot to warn on-comers that you were in the advance

mode.

Jim Kalnin never shed his connection to the intrinsic properties of this altruistic, idealistic habitat. He changed his *place* as he became a teacher at Okanagan College and moved on with its growth to become a professor at UBCO, but his orientation to the sacredness of place remained intact. He retired from UBCO in 2010 and in his wake left a successive generation of young visual artists who also felt it necessary to address the influence of modernity on the natural environment. Yet Kalnin is not - nor has been -



heavy handed in his approach to the issues of global sustainability. He has maintained the 'Feather" touch and, as light as a serendipitous nudge towards awareness: Kalnin paints reminders of the encroachment of man upon his fellow creatures and Earth which we all share in common.

The iconic image of the fish flopped on top of the glassy high-rise, where more windows than evident structure reflect a fresh airy sky, puts the size of man in direct relationship to the *dilemma* of man's dominion over the other species. The inhabitants of this building would not measure up to a fish tail-bone. Kalnin has placed within the painting's modest frame a reverberating image. He has titled this piece *All Inclusive* like the time-share holiday spots of Mexico. These condos, often R&R sugar shacks or snowbird retirement villas, are not necessarily the primary residences of those who dwell in them. As modernity moves in, the flora and fauna

are forced to move out and like this fish, they often flounder, high and dry, a testament to man's excess. But a moralistic or didactic tone is NOT what comes across in *All Inclusive*. The painting grants status to the fishy position. Funny thoughts arise such as the smell this great-scaled-one must be exerting upon the inhabitants of the shiny building or the awe that its size inspires beside a comparatively diminutive man.

In 2005, Kalnin painted a bear roaming upright through a cityscape and there was more stature and presence in that bear than in the sophisticated landscape it traversed through. But there was also something lost in Mr. Bear's walk through the cement city. "Like a feather is wafted downwards from an eagle in its flight, a feeling of sadness comes o're me." writes Henry Wadsworth Longfellow about his feelings as dusk falls. Kalnin's paintings (and works on paper) are like a poignant butterfly kiss with sincere, concerned humility at man's place within the cosmos.



Jim Kalnin has been coping with a dual existence that has brought about his visual bilingualism. His work is seated in abstraction and has the attributes of the intellectual as well as the instinctual. But he also has developed an acute awareness of the imposition of societal structures onto the natural which he represents within depictive genres.

Kalnin doesn't slap us towards consciousness, he *eases* us towards it. He brings alive the underbelly of industrialization while still speaking with reverence of Mother Earth.


When he moved away from Stock's Meadow and into Kelowna, he and his partner, Lois, purchased an old church in Lake Country

where he has lived and worked for many years. Artwork now graces the interior and creative landscaping - including a water fall - compliment the spiritually intended building. He has managed to find an intrinsic compromise between man and his environment both virtually and creatively.

One Planet - 2009, oil on canvas, 84" x 168"




Rodilla Del Diablo - 2011, oil on canvas, 48"x36"
















































